<b>14th Street Community Center</b>	\$8,853.33	The 14th Street Community Center in Portsmouth, OH, will launch a nutrition series program at the 17th Street Community Center. The class will feature nutrition, safe food handling, and basic cooking classes for youth.
<b>A New Beginning Pregnancy Resource Center</b>	\$3,570.00	A New Beginning Pregnancy Resource Center in Huntington, WV, will purchase diapers and wipes for infants in its parenting program.
<b>American Lung Association</b>	\$34,700.00	The American Lung Association (ALA) will implement the Not On Tobacco® (N-O-T) program across Boone, Cabell, Kanawha, Lincoln, Logan, Mason, Mingo, Putnam, and Wayne counties, WV. Adult facilitators will lead the 10-session tobacco and vaping cessation program for youth ages 14 to 19. ALA also will pilot integrating a youth facilitator into the N-O-T program.
<b>Appalachia Reach Out</b>	\$38,500.00	Appalachia Reach Out in Inez, KY, will purchase shelf-stable, frozen and fresh foods for weekly distributions to Martin County, KY, families; restock five Martin County elementary school-based Family Resource and Youth Services Centers' mini-pantries; and launch a new, collaborative program aimed at alleviating summer food insecurity and social isolation among youth for whom transportation is a barrier.
<b>Appalachian Children's Music and Arts Foundation</b>	\$5,000.00	Appalachian Children's Music and Arts Foundation in Kenova, WV, will provide Kindermusic therapy classes for children from early intervention programs in Cabell County.
<b>Arts in Action</b>	\$10,292.42	Arts in Action's SuperStars program will provide inclusive arts classes for individuals with disabilities in Cabell, Kanawha, and Putnam counties, WV. Classes will be offered at the Arts in Action studio in Hurricane, Bridget's Dance Academy in Huntington, two day habilitation centers in Kanawha County, and Huntington Middle School.
<b>ASCEND Counseling and Recovery Services</b>	\$7,692.10	ASCEND in Portsmouth, OH, will purchase welcome kits for women entering its supportive housing program and evidence-based curriculum materials for group counseling sessions.
<b>Ashland First United Methodist Church</b>	\$7,000.00	Ashland First United Methodist Church will purchase one month of food for its food pantry in Boyd County, KY.

<b>Aspire Achievement Project</b>	\$2,500.00	Aspire in Charleston, WV, will purchase a laptop, portable printer, and software for staff use.
<b>BackpackBuddy.Org</b>	\$19,430.00	BackpackBuddy.Org will purchase food, personal care items, postage, and boxes to ship to students in Kanawha County, WV, and Martin County, KY, who are enrolled in the summer backpack program.
<b>Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Tri-State</b>	\$12,000.00	Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Tri-State (BBBSTS) will expand match support programming for mentee/mentor matches, mentee families, and wait-listed families across the organization's nine-county service area. BBBSTS will also outfit a family resource room at its Huntington, WV, office to provide a welcoming, private waiting area for families and a neutral space for mentee/mentor meetings.
<b>Bob Burdette Center</b>	\$11,271.68	The Bob Burdette Center in Charleston, WV, will purchase garden equipment, soil, plants, and seeds for its Healthy Habits program community garden. The center also will purchase hygiene and personal care items to distribute to program participants during lessons and family events.
<b>Boone County Health Department</b>	\$23,197.99	The Boone County Quick Response Team will purchase food, hygiene and household items, clothing, and temporary shelter items for clients. The organization also will purchase a desktop computer and two iPads for staff use.
<b>Boone Memorial Hospital</b>	\$28,595.43	Boone Memorial Hospital (BMH) will purchase A1C and cardiovascular testing supplies to support patients enrolled in its FARMacy program. Funds will also be used to purchase produce, meat, and dairy for BMH's medically indicated food box program. The coordinator who oversees both programs will take an online diabetes self-management course.
<b>Cabell-Wayne Association of the Blind</b>	\$11,706.95	Cabell-Wayne Association of the Blind (CWAB) will purchase adaptive devices and supplies, including glucometers, lancing devices, strips, lancets, alcohol swabs and sharps containers, for clients who have diabetes or prediabetes. Funds also will be used to offset diabetes medication costs, provide diabetes education support groups, and purchase adaptive educational materials for clients and AEDs for the CWAB office.
<b>Capitol Market</b>	\$15,000.00	Capitol Market in Charleston, WV, will hire a seasonal SNAP Stretch coordinator to assist in validating and issuing SNAP Stretch dollars on site. The coordinator will connect with daycare and senior centers to provide program materials and information about offerings.
<b>Catholic Charities West Virginia</b>	\$12,600.00	Catholic Charities will launch the Relatives as Parents Program in Cabell County, WV, to support kinship care families. Participating caregivers will attend a monthly educational presentation designed to help them meet the needs of the children in their care. While caregivers attend presentations and connect with peer attendees, children will concurrently play, receive homework help,

		and complete an art activity. Each session will conclude with the caregivers and children sharing a family meal.
<b>Charleston Thunder Sled Hockey</b>	\$6,000.00	Charleston Thunder Sled Hockey will purchase jerseys, sleds, protective gear, helmets, and gloves for new players and/or players who have outgrown equipment.
<b>Children's Home Society of West Virginia</b>	\$20,000.00	The Children's Home Society of West Virginia will purchase food items for the Cabell County Family Support Center at the Nancy Tonkin Children's Resource Center in Huntington, WV.
<b>Children's Therapy Clinic</b>	\$15,000.00	Children's Therapy Clinic in Charleston, WV, will engage contract therapists to provide visits for children receiving social skills group therapy, music therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and speech therapy.
<b>Christian Help of Mingo County</b>	\$10,000.00	Christian Help of Mingo County will transport seniors and low-income clients from Mingo County, WV, to access goods, services, and medical appointments. The organization will also deliver senior food boxes to clients who do not have access to transportation.
<b>Community Assistance Referral Service</b>	\$5,519.97	Community Assistance Referral Service in Ashland, KY, will purchase emergency food and baby items for its clients, as well as three laptops for its staff.
<b>Community Autism Resources and Education Systems</b>	\$21,500.00	CARES in Hurricane, WV, will provide community-building events designed to embrace, celebrate, and connect autistic children and their families. The organization will host inclusive family events with sensory-friendly activities and accommodations designed for autistic children, as well as opportunities for families to connect with support specialists.
<b>Community Bridge</b>	\$15,742.02	Community Bridge in St. Albans, WV, will purchase items to outfit its resource center kitchen, which will be used during Cooking 101 courses to teach participants basic food preparation skills and how to make healthy food choices, create meals with leftovers, stock pantry items, and shop on a budget with coupons and SNAP benefits. Advanced courses will be offered to teach special skills such as canning or holiday meal planning.
<b>Community Mission Outreach</b>	\$8,000.00	Community Mission Outreach in Chesapeake, OH, will purchase food for pantry distributions and replace broken wheels on grocery carts used by pantry clients.
<b>Compass Point Housing</b>	\$8,100.00	Compass Point Housing will purchase welcome kits for clients who reside in its recovery homes in Lawrence and Scioto counties, OH.
<b>CONTACT Huntington</b>	\$9,725.00	CONTACT Huntington will conduct comprehensive board development, evaluation, and education activities for its board members.
<b>Court Street Ministries</b>	\$3,878.64	Court Street Ministries in Gallipolis, OH, will purchase fresh fruits and vegetables from local farmers to distribute to food pantry patrons. During pantry distribution, families will be eligible to register for Friday morning food preparation and freezing demonstration classes.

<b>East Kentucky Dream Center</b>	\$15,000.00	The East Kentucky Dream Center will purchase nonperishable food for its Food on Foot ministry in Pike County, KY; Mingo County, WV; and Floyd County, KY.
<b>Eastern Cabell County Humanities Organization</b>	\$7,500.00	Eastern Cabell County Humanities Organization in Milton, WV, will purchase canned protein to include in food orders for households each month.
<b>Ebenezer Medical Outreach</b>	\$40,500.00	Ebenezer Medical Outreach (EMO) in Huntington, WV, will build its organizational capacity and expand key clinical services and community outreach programs. EMO will implement print and digital marketing strategies; expand on-site dental services; purchase food to extend its FARMacy WV program through the fall; engage contractual services to install a drip irrigation system in the organization's community garden; and purchase garden supplies.
<b>EnAct Community Action</b>	\$22,500.00	EnAct Community Action in Charleston, WV, will purchase food items to support four food pantries in Kanawha County, one food pantry in Boone County, and a backpack program in Western Putnam County.
<b>Faith in Action of the River Cities</b>	\$4,116.94	Faith in Action of the River Cities' Executive Director will attend the National Volunteer Caregiving Network Conference. Funds will also be used to purchase specific foods for care receivers who have food allergies, food intolerances, or special medical needs.
<b>Gallia County Council on Aging</b>	\$9,970.00	The Gallia County Council on Aging (GCCA) in Gallipolis, OH, will provide a senior center compliance and education training for its human resources department and a professional training course in nonprofit accounting for its financial administrator. GCCA also will purchase file cabinets to protect client information.
<b>God's Hands At Work</b>	\$10,000.00	God's Hands At Work will support clients in Gallia County, OH, and Mason County, WV, with the purchase of food and boxes for its food pantry, nonperishable food items for its blessing box, food for its youth summer feeding program, and food for Thanksgiving food baskets and Christmas food bags.
<b>God's Pantry Food Bank</b>	\$37,000.00	Through its Produce to Plate program, God's Pantry Food Bank will purchase fresh produce for distribution through free summer produce markets at partner pantry and meal program sites across five counties. Funding also will enable God's Pantry to purchase equipment and food for a pantry located within a school in Martin County.
<b>Grace Fellowship, dba Grace Community Kitchen</b>	\$15,600.00	The Grace Fellowship Community Kitchen in Pikeville, KY, will purchase food for the kitchen's twice-weekly meal program.
<b>Habitat for Humanity of the Tri-State</b>	\$5,968.98	Habitat for Humanity of the Tri-State in Huntington, WV, will purchase computers and monitors for staff use.
<b>Hand in Hand Ministries</b>	\$15,220.00	Hand in Hand Ministries will purchase fresh produce, toiletries, and cleaning supplies to supplement food boxes distributed in Floyd County, KY. The organization also will replace outdated and broken pantry equipment.

<b>Harvest for the Hungry</b>	\$5,000.00	Harvest for the Hungry in Ironton, OH, will purchase supplemental nourishment drinks for seniors participating in the Commodity Senior Food Program.
<b>Heart and Hand Outreach Ministries</b>	\$12,000.00	Heart and Hand Outreach Ministries in South Charleston, WV, will purchase food and hygiene items to supply weekend bags for youth at South Charleston Middle School.
<b>Helping Hands of Greenup County</b>	\$5,989.00	Helping Hands of Greenup County will purchase and install a phone system for the organization's thrift store, pantry, and offices in Greenup, KY.
<b>Hillcrest Bruce United Methodist Ministries</b>	\$32,000.00	Hillcrest Bruce United Methodist Ministries in Ashland, KY, will implement the Healthy Living Project, which will provide dentures to people in need.
<b>Hope's Place</b>	\$27,000.00	Hope's Place in Ashland, KY, will provide RISE community training and educational groups that focus on sexting, cyber bullying, grooming through gaming, and understanding healthy and unhealthy relationships. The child advocacy center will also offer Darkness to Light, a specialized training focused on prevention of child sexual abuse and other forms of abuse, as well as mandated reporting.
<b>Huntington Children's Museum</b>	\$22,505.00	Huntington Children's Museum's Therapy Through Play program will partner with occupational therapists from Developmental Therapy Center to create sensory and therapeutic play guides that will be displayed throughout the museum and on the museum's website. The signage will prompt caregivers to engage with their children in ways that facilitate gross motor, fine motor, visual motor, sensory, communication, literacy, social, and cognitive development. The museum also will host sensory-sensitive events with reduced lighting, noise, and attendance, and provide family passes to children served by Developmental Therapy Center.
<b>Huntington First Church of the Nazarene</b>	\$2,350.00	Huntington First Church of the Nazarene (HFCN) will explore opportunities to develop an intentional community hub for gathering, healthy food access, wellness education, and resource connections in the Highlawn neighborhood of Huntington, WV. HFCN will visit organizations in West Virginia, Kentucky, and Ohio to learn about promising social enterprise models. It will also conduct outreach and distribute healthy meal kits at local community events.
<b>Huntington Museum of Art</b>	\$8,760.00	Through its ArtWorks! program, Huntington Museum of Art will provide therapeutic art workshops for teenagers in substance use disorder recovery. Lessons will focus on the creation of personalized objects for daily use, which foster a sense of accomplishment and reflect the participant's ability to discover, learn, and create.
<b>Huntington Regional Chamber of Commerce Foundation</b>	\$15,000.00	The Huntington Regional Chamber of Commerce will host a series of community trainings designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of nonprofit professionals and build area nonprofits' capacity to serve the community. The Chamber will make training

		materials and resources available through its website and newsletter.
<b>Impact Prevention</b>	\$14,500.00	Impact Prevention will continue its youth-led programming at Lawrence County and Scioto County, OH, middle and high schools. Certified Prevention Specialists will assist youth-led teams in prevention efforts focused on topics like mental health, suicide prevention, and alcohol and substance misuse. The teams will lead prevention programming at local elementary schools, organize county and regional youth summits, and participate in community connection events and beautification projects. In addition, Impact Prevention will engage youth as peer mentors for the organization's summer camp and after-school programs based in Ironton, OH.
<b>Inspiring Dreams Network</b>	\$15,290.00	Inspiring Dreams Network in Hurricane, WV, will continue the development of its online youth resource portal for at-risk youth, adults, families, and the community organizations that serve them.
<b>Itty Bitty Therapy Horses</b>	\$10,000.00	Staff members with Itty Bitty Therapy Horses (IBTH) in Scott Depot, WV, will receive certification as Equine Specialists in Mental Health and Learning through the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International. The certification will equip IBTH to work alongside mental health professionals in equine-assisted therapy sessions and serve as the equine expert during equine-human interactions.
<b>Judi's Place for Kids</b>	\$7,395.00	Judi's Place for Kids, a children's advocacy center serving eastern Kentucky, will contract for digital document storage. In addition, staff members will participate in emotional intelligence training and individual coaching sessions aimed at building communication and collaboration skills.
<b>Kanawha County Dental Health Council</b>	\$6,992.38	Kanawha County Dental Health Council will purchase toothbrushes, toothpaste, and dental floss for distribution to students through school-based dental clinics and school nurses' offices in Kanawha County, WV.
<b>Kanawha Valley Home</b>	\$9,399.80	The Kanawha Valley Home will purchase bed frames, mattresses and covers, and chests of drawers for its sober living apartment expansion project.
<b>KPCC Counseling</b>	\$19,774.00	KPCC Counseling (KPCC) will purchase office equipment for its new satellite office at Beverly Hills United Methodist Church in Huntington, WV. KPCC also will provide mental health counseling sessions for participants in its client assistance program.
<b>Larry Joe Harless Community Center</b>	\$12,000.00	The Larry Joe Harless Community Center will provide youth living at or below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level with one-year memberships to its center.
<b>Lawrence County (OH) Health Department</b>	\$8,299.43	The Lawrence County Health Department (LCHD) in Ironton, OH, will begin piloting obesity prevention programming for adults. LCHD will conduct a nine-week nutrition education course and concurrent walking challenge for participants. Information gathered from



		participant surveys will be used to guide implementation of a second nine-week nutrition education course and walking challenge.
<b>Lawrence County (KY) Health Department</b>	\$8,532.25	The Lawrence County Health Department in Louisa, KY, will provide a transportation assistance program for individuals receiving cancer treatment and a Family Fun Fitness Project for children to promote healthy eating and physical activity.
<b>Lewis County Family Resource Network</b>	\$18,400.00	Try This West Virginia will provide mini-grants to community groups operating in Boone, Cabell, Kanawha, Lincoln, Logan, Mason, Mingo, Western Putnam, or Wayne counties, WV. Funds also will cover registration and travel scholarships for youth to attend the Try This Youth Summit. In addition, the organization will contract with a project coordinator to facilitate its youth-focused activities throughout the year.
<b>Libera</b>	\$33,759.00	Libera will train new mentors and offer new Libera groups in public schools, youth reporting centers, foster congregate care locations, and/or juvenile detention centers throughout Cabell and Kanawha counties, WV. Funding also will be used to print volunteer and participant workbooks and manuals, cover meeting expenses associated with hosting volunteer trainings, and reimburse mileage for Libera staff to attend trainings and group programs.
<b>Lily's Place</b>	\$20,000.00	Staff members at Lily's Place in Huntington, WV, will become certified instructors of the Crisis Prevention Institute's Verbal Intervention Program with an emphasis on trauma. Once certified, the staff members will train Lily's Place team members and offer trainings to other community organizations.
<b>Manna Meal</b>	\$10,000.00	Manna Meal will purchase food for daily breakfast and lunch, and dinner twice a week, at its off-site location in Downtown Charleston, WV. The organization will also purchase food for pantry bags to distribute to clients who visit its emergency food pantry or through its food truck in neighborhoods on the West Side and East End of Charleston.
<b>Marshall University Research Corporation</b>	\$31,174.40	Trainees enrolled in the Workforce Development Prevention Trainee project through the Prevention Empowerment Partnership (PEP) in Huntington, WV, will participate in a substance use prevention leadership program. Participants will receive education on the principles of evidence-based substance use prevention, leadership, peer-to-peer teaching, mentoring, entrepreneurship, and community coalition building. They will then work directly with youth in local schools and summer and after-school programming.
<b>Mason City Public Library</b>	\$6,400.00	The Mason County Public Library System will offer the Cook, Eat, Thrive cooking and nutrition class for families at its Mason City branch.
<b>Mason County Family Resource Network</b>	\$5,000.00	The Family Resource Network of Mason County, WV, will partner with nurses, social workers, and counselors

		in Mason County Schools to distribute hygiene kits to students in need.
<b>McCorkle Free Will Baptist Church Healing Heart Food Pantry</b>	\$5,565.00	McCorkle Free Will Baptist Church Outreach Ministries' Healing Heart Food Pantry (HHFP) in Sod, WV, will purchase protein, grains, and produce for the pantry. HHFP will also purchase a laptop computer, software for financial and tracking system management, a printer, and shelving units.
<b>McDowell County Commission on Aging</b>	\$33,424.00	The McDowell County Commission on Aging (MCCA) will expand its Spit It Out WV project to Cabell, Kanawha, and Lincoln counties and continue its work in Mingo County. In partnership with the West Virginia Division of Tobacco Prevention, MCCA will provide educational and tobacco cessation workshops to address smokeless tobacco use and its impacts on the body. The project coordinator will attend community events and conduct oral health screenings in Cabell, Kanawha, Lincoln, and Mingo counties to build wider community awareness of the harmful effects of smokeless tobacco use. MCCA also will launch Through With Chew, a national campaign to educate people about the dangers of smokeless tobacco.
<b>Midian Leadership Project</b>	\$25,500.00	Midian Leadership Project in Charleston, WV, will purchase food to provide nutritious meals and snacks at its extended-hours, after-school program at Midian Safe Haven. Funds also will support a VISTA on Midian's leadership team and an organizational consultant to engage in facilitated fundraising strategy development and sustainability planning.
<b>Neighbors Helping Neighbors</b>	\$5,950.00	Neighbors Helping Neighbors in Ashland, KY, will conduct comprehensive assessments and workshops with its board members to determine and address needs within the organization.
<b>Ohio River Valley T1D</b>	\$2,200.00	Ohio River Valley T1D in Wheelersburg, OH, will assemble resource bags for newly diagnosed patients with Type 1 Diabetes. Bags will be distributed to individuals residing in Boyd, Carter, and Greenup counties, KY; Gallia, Lawrence, and Scioto counties, OH; and Cabell, Kanawha, and Wayne counties, WV.
<b>Parents Auxiliary</b>	\$5,000.00	Parents Auxiliary will host farmers' market events at Ken Ellis Memorial Park in Charleston, WV. At these market events, it will distribute produce vouchers to community members and provide nutrition education and cooking demonstrations.
<b>Pathways</b>	\$14,998.75	Pathways will implement a collaborative project called "The Appetizer" to provide resources to people experiencing homelessness in Boyd County, KY. A peer support specialist will organize and host weekly gatherings at The Neighborhood in Ashland for informal discussion on topics related to homelessness. Participants will be offered care bags and will receive assistance in obtaining identification documents and connecting with other agencies and services.



<b>Positive People Association</b>	\$6,750.00	Positive People Association will offer the SHINE (Support Healthy Living, Nurturing Development In a Safe Environment) summer program at the Scott Community Center in Huntington, WV, for youth in kindergarten through eighth grades. The program provides S.T.E.M. education and opportunities for exercise and gardening.
<b>Postpartum Support International - WV Chapter</b>	\$6,462.00	Postpartum Support International West Virginia will train providers from Cabell, Wayne, Lincoln, Logan, Boone, Western Putnam, Kanawha, Mason, or Mingo counties, WV, in perinatal mental health.
<b>PRIDE Community Services</b>	\$23,500.00	PRIDE Community Services will implement the Better Living Logan program for clients who participate in senior services, in-home care services, and housing programs in Logan, WV. Staff members will shop at local stores and provide tailored, diabetic-friendly food boxes for clients. This program will also provide dietary supplement drinks for clients who need additional nutrition.
<b>Primary Plus</b>	\$15,000.00	Primary Plus in Grayson, KY, will expand its community mental health and suicide prevention efforts in Carter, Boyd, and Greenup counties. Community health workers (CHWs) will facilitate Mental Health First Aid trainings for educators, parents, and community members. CHWs will also become certified as facilitators of Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST). After certification, CHWs will provide ASIST training to school administrators and counselors, healthcare professionals, emergency responders, youth service workers, and/or caregivers of individuals struggling with suicidal ideations.
<b>RLB Ministries</b>	\$32,180.00	RLB Ministries in Ironton, OH, will purchase food for weekend meal backpacks and children's clothing items; support a school-based food pantry at Collins Career Technical Center; and purchase supplies for a wellness program for students served by the Lawrence County Educational Service Center (LCESC).
<b>Ramey Estep Homes</b>	\$16,670.00	Ramey Estep Homes will continue to offer Camp Courage at Boyd County Public Schools and expand the program to the Fairview Independent School District near Ashland, KY. Camp Courage engages elementary, middle, and high school students in fun and therapeutic activities during the summer months and throughout the school year.
<b>Recovery Group of Southern West Virginia</b>	\$9,300.00	The Recovery Group of Southern West Virginia in Logan will purchase household items and cleaning supplies for residential program graduates transitioning to more permanent housing.
<b>Religious Coalition for Community Renewal</b>	\$24,483.22	The Religious Coalition for Community Renewal will expand its homeownership program to Huntington, WV, and purchase technology improvements for its Charleston and Huntington offices.
<b>Ronald McDonald House of Huntington, WV</b>	\$25,246.66	Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) of Huntington, WV, will purchase food and kitchen

		equipment to support its Meals that Mend program, which provides daily meals for families staying at the house.
<b>Safe Harbor of Northeast Kentucky</b>	\$26,000.00	Safe Harbor of Northeast Kentucky in Ashland will use funding to purchase food for shelter meals, client bedding, hygiene and cleaning supplies, and medications. Funding will also be used for bus fare and fuel costs for transporting clients to appointments, court, school, work, and a variety of community resources.
<b>Saint Paul Community and Economic Development Corporation</b>	\$5,000.00	Saint Paul Community and Economic Development Corporation (SPCEDC) will purchase household items and food for future residents at Hezekiah House, a men's recovery home opening soon in St. Albans, WV. SPCEDC will also purchase accounting software for the organization.
<b>Saint Peter's Episcopal Church</b>	\$25,000.00	St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Huntington, WV, will contract with an outreach organizer to oversee and organize volunteers, naloxone distributions, and care bag and weekly meal programs.
<b>Scioto Christian Ministry</b>	\$12,000.00	Scioto Christian Ministry will purchase healthy foods for meals served to people experiencing homelessness at its shelter in Portsmouth, OH.
<b>Scott Depot Christ Fellowship, dba Camp Appalachia</b>	\$20,000.00	Camp Appalachia will recruit youth to attend Camp Grit and Grace, an overnight camp that supports children in kindergarten through eighth grade who have been impacted by the opioid epidemic, are in foster care, have incarcerated parents, or are at high risk of substance use disorder.
